

Limited Submission Announcement

A limited submission opportunity is available from the Johnson & Johnson Early Career Scholars Program and has been posted to the [UTSA Limited Submission webpage](#).

WiSTEM²D J&J Scholars Program

The Johnson & Johnson Scholars Award Program aims to fuel the development of female STEM²D leaders and feed the STEM²D talent pipeline by awarding and sponsoring women at critical points in their research careers, in each of the STEM²D disciplines: Science, Technology, Engineering, Math, Manufacturing and Design.

The awards will fund one woman per discipline who has completed her advanced degree, who is working as an assistant professor and who is not yet tenured at an accredited university or design institution. The goal is to fuel the research passion of the awarded women and inspire career paths in their respective STEM²D fields.

Eligibility

Female non-tenured assistant professors or faculty members in equivalent positions at a University or Academic Institute (collectively, “University”) in one of the STEM²D disciplines are eligible to apply to participate in the Scholars Program.

The eligible STEM²D disciplines are: Science, Technology, Engineering, Math, Manufacturing and Design.

The female scholar should have a minimum degree for the appropriate field:

- Science; M.D., Ph.D.
- Technology; Ph.D.
- Engineering; Ph.D.
- Math; M.S., Ph.D.
- Manufacturing; Ph.D.
- Design; M.A., M.S., MDes, MArch, MFA, MLA, Ph.D.

Award Amount

The Scholars Award is a 3-year award in the gross amount of \$150,000. The Scholars Award will be paid in three (3) installments of US \$50,000 per year of the 3-year scholarship period, payable in 2019, subject to compliance with the terms and conditions of the program’s Agreement.

Application Limit

Each University and/or Academic Institute can support and recommend one applicant per each STEM²D discipline.

Application Process

The following materials should be uploaded to the [Limited Submissions Application](#) form:

- (1) Applicant’s Curriculum Vitae (3-page maximum, PDF), and
- (2) Research Summary (1,000-word maximum plus one page of images, PDF)

These instructions supersede the standard limited submissions application instructions.
