

SUBMISSION NOTE

Two (2) files should be uploaded to the Limited Submissions Application form – (1) a PDF file with the CV Information noted below (item 1), and (2) a combined PDF file with items 2-4, as they are outlined below.

FORMATTING INSTRUCTIONS

- 12 pt., Times New Roman font (TNR)
- 1" margins all around
- Spacing between responses can be included, however, all text for responses themselves should be single-spaced.
- Additional notes for Research Description: You may include embedded figures. Captions should be single-spaced in 12-pt TNR.

INTERNAL PROPOSAL INSTRUCTIONS/OUTLINE

1. Curriculum Vitae (CV) Information

- Proposed field of research
- Undergraduate and graduate education
- Postdoctoral positions and, as applicable, internships, residency, and clinical training
- Positions held, employers, and dates
- Honors, awards and list of publications: complete list of articles published or in press by peer-reviewed journals for which you were first author or a contributing author. *Note: Only list manuscripts that have been published or that you anticipate will be published before October 1, 2019.*

2. Other Support

List all proposals submitted that have already been funded or are still pending final funding determination, using the following format. *Note - Do not include start-up funds.*

- Title of Project
- Sponsor
- Award Period (start/end dates)
- Effort Committed (in person-months)
- Status (Awarded, Pending)

3. Self-Assessment (no > 1,400 characters per bullet point, 4,200 characters total)

Please answer each of the following self-assessment items.

- Briefly describe your most significant research contribution to date.
- Highlight the most innovative and novel aspects of your proposed research. Describe a risky or creative approach you might use in pursuit of your goals.
- The program aims to support both the research and the researchers. Describe how you would benefit from the receipt of a Pew scholarship. In addition, reflect on why your particular research is personally significant.

4. Research Proposal

- Description of Proposed Research (no > than 5 pages, single-spaced)
 - Statement of the Project to be undertaken, including aims, objectives and methods to be used.
 - Potential significance of the research
 - Detail about how this project fits into your “big picture” plans.
 - References should be included at the end of the description and are not counted towards the 5-page, single-spaced limit.
