What do per diem rates cover?

The LARC operates on a cost recovery basis. The following provides examples of items covered by per diems as part of standard animal care but are subject to change.

- 1. Animal housing, facility maintenance, environmental controls and monitoring
- 2. Standard LARC diet and bedding substrate
- 3. Husbandry, animal enrichment, and colony health surveillance
- 4. Routine prophylactic health care (non-research related) and Vet. consult
- 5. Equipment operation, maintenance, and replacement (due to normal wear)
- 6. Routine cage changes
 - a. Ventilated mouse cages, every three weeks, and rat cages, weekly.
 - b. Static rodent cages changed once or twice a week

What do per diem rates NOT cover?

The following are examples of items NOT covered by per diem costs. Such activities are charged directly to individual investigators:

- 1. Deviation from standard care (housing, feed, bedding, etc.)
- 2. Veterinary care (treatment) resulting from experimental manipulations
- 3. Technical and administrative services and assistance, beyond standard animal care activities in support of research activities
- 4. Extra quarantine required tests and treatment

Additional Services Available Upon Request

- 1. Surgical services (major/minor procedures), cannulation, implantation, and various technical procedures
- 2. Animal data collection, measurements, sample collection, etc.
- 3. LARC surgical and diagnostic equipment and training
- 4. Special husbandry requirements or treatments
- 5. Necropsy
